Capital Needs/Bonding Recommendation and Timeline

Mrs. Neubig reviewed building specific and district-wide capital needs and possible bonding scenarios as reviewed with IBIC. Based on the current debt schedule it was recommended that the district bond either 6.92 million or 13 million to address current and projected capital needs as well as proposed building alterations regardless of the option selected. Mrs. Neubig shared that with the proposed closing of John Lyman School, the cost savings and the costs avoided could result in a neutral budget impact depending on the scenario.

Due Diligence Tuttle Road Land Parcel Korn School MOU

There was no new information available relative to this topic other than that the due diligence timeframe would not start until after a successful referendum.

Finance Committee Charge and Schedule

Mr. Augur will schedule a Finance Committee meeting in order to discuss tax implications for community members in both towns given the proposed budget once it has been presented and the impact of the bonded amount should the district decide to go to referendum to address capital needs and/or school alterations.
