## Regional School District 13 Board of Education Finance Committee Minutes of the meeting of Wednesday, September 12, 2012

The Committee would like to issue pension benefit statements to the employees this year, though we are not obligated to do so.

Committee goals and objectives: Field house funding, building utilization study, budget timeline, budget presentation, among others.
