### REGIONAL SCHOOL DISTRICT 13 EXPLANATORY TEXT

The following question will be voted on by the electors of the Towns of Durham and Middlefield, Connecticut at a referendum held on August 27, 2024. This explanatory text was authorized to be prepared by the Regional School District 13 Board of Education and is prepared in accordance with Section 9-369b of the Connecticut General Statutes.

The amendment to the Plan of Regionalization described in Question 1 below shall be approved only upon a majority vote in each of the Towns of Durham and Middlefield in favor of the amendment.

#### QUESTION 1:

"SHALL THE REGIONAL SCHOOL DISTRICT 13 PLAN OF REGIONALIZATION BE AMENDED TO AUTHORIZE THE REGION 13 BOARD OF EDUCATION TO ADOPT A THREE-SCHOOL MODEL WITH PRE-K-GRADE 5 AT MEMORIAL SCHOOL IN MIDDLEFIELD, GRADES 6-8 AT STRONG MIDDLE SCHOOL IN DURHAM AND GRADES 9-12 AT COGINCHAUG REGIONAL HIGH SCHOOL IN DURHAM AND TO CLOSE FREDERICK F. BREWSTER SCHOOL IN DURHAM AND JOHN LYMAN ELEMENTARY SCHOOL IN MIDDLEFIELD UPON THE TRANSITION TO THE THREE-SCHOOL MODEL?"

#### **EXPLANATORY TEXT**:

#### Background:

On April 10, 1968, the State Board of Education voted to approve the establishment of Regional School District 13 (the "District"), composed of the towns of Durham and Middlefield, based on a Plan of Regionalization for the District. Pursuant to state law, the electors of the members towns of Durham and Middlefield must approve any amendment to the District's Plan of Regionalization.

#### What is the Board of Education Proposing?

- The Board of Education is proposing an amendment to the Plan of Regionalization to authorize the transition of the District to a three-school model. Under the proposed three-school model, students in various grades would attend the following schools:
  - Students in grades prekindergarten through grade 5 would attend Memorial School in Middlefield;
  - Students in grades 6 through 8 would attend Strong Middle School in Durham; and

 Students grades 9 through 12 would attend Coginchaug Regional High School in Durham

## What Changes Would be Made to the District's Schools?

- To implement this new three-school model, the following changes to schools would occur:
  - Memorial School would be renovated and expanded into a prekindergarten through grade 5 school.
  - Frederick F. Brewster School in Durham and John Lyman Elementary School in Middlefield would be closed through the process of transitioning to a three-school model.
- During the renovation and construction processes, students will be located in other District school buildings temporarily.

# How Would These Projects Be Funded?

- The District intends to seek State funding for the projects described above.
- The District also intends to submit to referendum in the Towns of Durham and Middlefield a resolution to authorize the issuance of the District's notes and bonds to pay for the renovation of Memorial School in Middlefield.
