The RSD13 Board of Education invites you to participate in a series of community workshops regarding the development of a utilization plan for our District's schools. The first workshop will be held on **Tuesday**, **October 29**, **2013** in the cafeteria at Coginchaug Regional High School from 7:00 to 8:30 p.m.

The Board has selected Drummey Rosane Anderson, Inc. ("DRA") to develop the Facilities Utilization Study. DRA has already conducted building evaluations prior to meeting with town residents at the community workshops. They will be meeting with school staff to conduct programming and educational planning meetings throughout the fall. The first workshop will focus on gathering community input. DRA will hold subsequent workshops to identify possible alternatives for the District and will then shape specific recommendations for Board of Education consideration. The workshop schedule is:

Wednesday, December 11 -	ALTERNATIVES: Understanding the options
January 2014, TBD	SHAPING RECOMMENDATIONS for Board consideration

Frequently Asked Questions

Has the Board of Education made any decisions about the future of the schools?

The Board of Education has made no decisions about the utilization plan for the schools. All options and ideas are being considered.

I've attended previous Board of Education meetings about our school system. Why do I need to attend this meeting?

Your knowledge, understanding, and input are welcome and needed in this process. This is one of the key issues facing our community; there are many issues and options to explore. We hope that you will choose to continue to participate in this process.

I see there are three different community workshops being scheduled over the next few months. Should I attend all three workshops?

Yes. The focus of each workshop is different. The purpose of the October 29th workshop will be to **listen** to citizens and obtain community input. In December, the focus will be on taking information from the previous workshop and developing possible **alternatives** for the utilization study. Finally, the workshop in January will focus on the specific **recommendations** that may be proposed to the Board of Education. Workshops will build on each other.

What specific topic will be discussed at this first community workshop?

Concurrent breakout sessions will collect community input on the topics of:

- "Containers" the physical facilities
- "Contents" education programming
- "Currents" RSD13's trends, including demographics and enrollments
- "Children/students" focusing on the issues and needs of students

I have ideas about what's important for our schools. How can I share those ideas with DRA and the Board of Education?
